OCAC 2026 Overseas Youth Vocational Training Program (OYVTP)

Admission Prospectus

(Approved by the OCAC in document Qiao Sheng Yan Zi No.: 1140501507 of June 10th, 2024)

I. Purpose:

To promote high-quality technical and vocational education in Taiwan and offer diversified study opportunities for overseas compatriot students, the Overseas Community Affairs Council (OCAC) is organizing the OCAC 2026 Overseas Youth Vocational Training Program (OYVTP). This initiative aims to expand the development of outstanding technical and vocational talents.

II. Schools and course types

All subject courses in this program are classified by occupation to meet the actual needs of each industry. Equal emphasis is placed on subjects and training. The OCAC selects schools well-equipped with facilities to provide courses (schools and courses are detailed in the attached table).

III. Eligibility

- (1) Those who meet the following qualifications may apply for recommendation and will be admitted on a merit basis until the quota is filled:
- 1. Those who were born overseas and have obtained citizenship or permanent residency in the place of residence, or those who have left Taiwan and hold a Republic of China (Taiwan) passport with Overseas Compatriot Identity Endorsement.
- 2. Overseas compatriot youth who have graduated from the second year of high school or above (i.e. have graduated from the second year of high school in an overseas compatriot school in the place of residence or are equivalent to the second year of high school in such a school, including those who have graduated from the fifth grade of a British system secondary school) and meet the qualifications of the Regulations Regarding Study and Counseling Assistance for Overseas Compatriot Students in Taiwan, aged under 30 years old (born after July 1, 1995). Female applicants who have had children must submit relevant supporting documents. For each child, the applicant's age may be extended by 2 years, but the maximum age shall not exceed 35 years.
 - 3. Those who are in good health, have good conduct, and have no bad habits.
 - 4. Those whose academic qualifications meet the requirements for applying for various courses.
 - 5. Those who are proficient in Mandarin and have the ability to take notes in Mandarin.
- 6. Applicants in Thailand must hold Thai nationality if they do not possess the nationality of the Republic of China (Taiwan).
- 7. Applicants from Myanmar must have a permanent or long-term residence permit in their country of residence, possess Myanmar nationality as defined by the current Myanmar Citizenship Law (holders of valid identification such as a Naing, Ei, or Pyu card are eligible to apply; FRC, Passes, and similar documents are not considered valid proof of nationality), or hold a Republic of China (Taiwan) passport with an Overseas Compatriot Identity Endorsement.
 - (2) Applicants must hold a valid passport. Those who do not have a passport or hold a travel

permit are not allowed to apply. This does not apply to those who hold a travel permit valid for more than 3 years from Brunei. Proper review by each recommending unit is requested.

- (3) Those who have applied for the loss of the nationality of the Republic of China (Taiwan) and have already had it approved and have not yet obtained the citizenship(nationality) of another country are not allowed to apply.
- (4) Those who are citizens of the Mainland area, residents of Hong Kong or Macao, or hold passports issued by the Mainland area are not allowed to apply.

IV. How to apply:

- (1) Application location: Embassies, consulates, representative offices, offices or other institutions authorized by the ROC Ministry of Foreign Affairs (overseas institutions) or recommending units designated by the OCAC. Applicants should apply to the aforementioned units in their place of residence and are not allowed to apply across regions.
- (2) **Application time:** from June 15, 2025 to September 30, 2025 (for applicants who apply by mail, the local postmark shall be proof). After the recommending unit accepts the application and checks the endorsement, the application form should be sent by registered airmail to the relevant overseas institution for forwarding to the OCAC before October 3, 2024. Applications that are late or have incomplete documents or are sent by sea mail will not be accepted, and no application for extension of payment will be allowed.
- (3) Submission of documents: After the following documents are reviewed by the recommending unit, they will be forwarded to the OCAC via the overseas institution.
- 1. Applicants submit the information checklist. (As shown in Appendix 1, this form should be placed on the first page of the application form, and the remaining documents should be bound in the order of items in this document).
- 2. The application form must be made in duplicate (as shown in Attachment 2), each with a 2-inch frontal passport-style photo without hat taken within the last 6 months attached. The recommending unit shall keep one copy and send the other copy to the OCAC through the overseas institution.
 - 3. Affidavit and Overseas Compatriot Student Basic Information Card. (as attachments 3 and 4)
- 4. Submit a copy of the residence document of the place of residence (such as a copy of the local ID card or passport or the passport of the Republic of China (Taiwan) and the overseas compatriot identity endorsement page). For Thailand, additional documents proving Taiwanese origin and national identity certificate, or other nationality certification documents are required.
- 5. Photocopies of graduation (attendance) certificates and transcripts (foreign language documents must be translated into Mandarin) will be stamped after inspection by the recommending unit.
- (4) The application form, basic information card and affidavit must be filled in in detail, and the name and date of birth must match those stated on the overseas residence permit and academic certificates. When applying for a subject, please think carefully in advance and fill in preferences in order (applications that have been altered and not signed will not be allocated); the OCAC will allocate applicants according to the preferences after reviewing the applicants' recommendation eligibility.
- (5) Applicants should pay postage and telecommunications fee to the recommending unit of, at most, US\$20 per person, equivalent in the local currency. There is no need to pay other registration fees. For special reasons, the recommending unit can give fee reduction or exemption may be made at their discretion;

however, any fee increase must be approved by the OCAC. The above fee is only used for postage and telecommunications charges for sending the application form and may not be used for other purposes. Any remaining money shall be returned to the applicant.

V. Allocation, course start and admission regulations

- (1) Each course will be allocated in order according to the applications filled in by the qualified student. If the course applied for has not been offered, if there are still vacancies in a course that is offered, the course can be allocated in order according to other applications.
- (2) The training period for each course is from March 2026 to December 2027 (including the training period at school).
- (3) Check in for this course is from March 2nd to March 6th, 2026, and courses will officially start on March 9th of the same year(The actual date is subject to the regulations of each school); **students will cooperate with Taiwan's entry-related measures.**
- (4) According to Article 5 of the Enforcement Rules for the Issuance of ROC Visas to Foreign-Passport Holders: "MOFA and overseas missions may request the applicant to undergo an interview or submit travel plans, proof of familial relations, results of health examinations, proof of criminal record, proof of financial status, proof of the purpose of visit, information regarding the applicant's contacts, relatives or guarantor in the ROC, and other documents as required for the review process." Admitted students holding foreign passports must apply for a visa to enter Taiwan in accordance with relevant regulations before they can study.
- (5) After a student arrives in Taiwan, if the documents submitted are found to be incompatible with the admission qualifications or the information filled in the application forms is false, admission eligibility may be cancelled, and he/she must immediately return to his/her place of residence at his/her own expense.
- (6) Students must undergo a physical re-examination after coming to Taiwan. If they are found to have tuberculosis, mental illness or other chronic diseases and disabilities that do not meet the admission requirements of each school, they will not be allowed to enroll. Those who have already enrolled should be ordered to withdraw from school and must return to their place of residence at their own expense.
- 7) During the training period, students should abide by school rules. If they violate the rules or fail to accept guidance, they will be punished or ordered to withdraw from training depending on the seriousness of the case, and they will immediately return to their place of residence at their own expense.
- (8) In order to facilitate the school's care and safety of the students in training, students in the program will all stay in the school dormitories.
- (9) If students fail to register for school or drop out for any reason after coming to Taiwan, he/she must immediately return to his/her place of residence and are not allowed to stay in Taiwan.
- (10) The training of agricultural, industrial, commercial and home economics professionals requires relatively high funding. Applicants must prepare their living expenses and various fees payable in Taiwan; the government will not provide any subsidies.
- (11) Those who have been admitted through allocation are not allowed to apply to transfer courses or schools midway.
- (12) OYVTP programs are non-degree training programs entrusted to universities and colleges for training. They do not provide formal student status. Those who have passed the training period and results

meet the required standard will be issued a OYVTP graduation certificate in Mandarin and English by the schools in accordance with regulations; those who have completed the required number of credits and passed the exam will be issued a credit certificate by each host school in accordance with the relevant provisions of the "Continuing Education Regulations for Universities"; those who have not completed the required number of credits will be issued a certificate of study..

(13) Anyone who drops out or graduates from an OYVTP program (non-degree program) shall not apply to study in a vocational training program for 2 years.

VII. Regulations relating to student application for entry into Taiwan, residence and household registration

- (1) For foreign passport holders, please present 1. Republic of China (Taiwan) visa application form (please go to the website of the Bureau of Consular Affairs of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, URL: http://www.boca.gov.tw, click on visa/fill in the application online form area/general visa application form, fill in each field in order, download, print and sign); 2. Passport (valid for more than 6 months); 3. two 2inch color photos with white background taken within 6 months; 4. Notice of allocation; 5. Health examination certificate from the previous three months from a qualified overseas hospital approved by the Ministry of Health and Welfare (ask a local ROC overseas institution) (namely Health Certificate for Residence Application); please refer to the website of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention of the Ministry of Health and Welfare for details, URL: http://www.cdc.gov.tw Click on International Travel and Health/Foreigner Health Examination/Residence Health Examination); 6. Other relevant supporting documents required by our overseas institutions. Apply for a residence visa to come to Taiwan from our overseas institutions, and apply through the student online application system of the National Immigration Agency of the Ministry of the Interior (NIA) within 30 days from the day after entering the country. (https://coa.immigration.gov.tw/coa-frontend/student/entry) for an Alien Residence Certificate. If there is no foreign hospital recognized by the Ministry of Health and Welfare in the place where the overseas compatriot lives, contact an ROC overseas agency and follow the local visa procedures. When overseas students holding Thai passports apply for a visa at the ROC representative office in Thailand and enter Taiwan's airports or ports due to allocation, they must submit proof of Thai citizenship.
- (2) As a national without household registration in Taiwan, you should prepare at the place of residence 1. application form (submit 1 color photo with white background, in accordance with the national identity card specifications); 2. proof of identity of the place of residence or place of residence; 3. Taiwan passport or other documents that are sufficient to prove that you have Taiwan nationality; 4. A national police record certificate from the applicant's place of residence or place lived (valid within 6 months from the date of issue; minors are exempt); 5. Health examination certificate issued within the last 3 months by a qualified foreign hospital designated by the Centers for Disease Control of the Ministry of Health and Welfare or recognized by a Taiwan overseas institution in the country of residence (inquire at overseas institution in place of residence. (Health Certificate for Residence Application) (please see the website of the Centers for Disease Control Ministry of Health and Welfare: https://www.cdc.gov.tw / Click "International Travel and Health"/Foreigner Health Management/Health Examination for Foreign Degree Students (including Mainland Students)/Residence Examination; 6. Admission notice and other relevant supporting documents.

Apply to an overseas institution for transfer to the National Immigration Agency (NIA) for issue of a single-entry permit and a copy of the Taiwan Residence Certificate. Within 3 months from the day after entering Taiwan, go to the NIA with a copy of the residence certificate to replace the Taiwan Residence Certificate; those in Taiwan can prepare the above documents and entry permit, and apply for a Taiwan Residence Certificate through the NIA online student application system (https://coa.immigration.gov.tw/coa-frontend/student/entry).

(3) Those who have original household registration in Taiwan should, within 30 days, go to the household registration office at the place of residence to register move-in (entry) submitting an ROC passport with entry stamp or copy of entry document.

VIII. Related matters to note:

- (1) Applicants are requested to read this admission prospectus carefully before filling in various forms.
- (2) Overseas institutions and recommending units must confirm that the contents of each application form in Paragraph 3 of this prospectus related to application eligibility and Paragraph 4 related to application method are true before signing for recommendation.
- (3) After receiving the application form from each overseas institution, and after reviewing and approving the applicant to participate in the training, the OCAC will send the results of allocation to the relevant overseas institution to help the applicant to complete the formalities for travelling to Taiwan. You must arrive in Taiwan one week before the semester starts to check-in. If you exceed the deadline, you will not be allowed to apply to retain your admission qualifications.
- (4) Registered or unregistered admitted students may not apply to retain their admission eligibility for any reason.
- (5) Overseas institutions and recommending units are requested to inform applicants that all required expenses, daily pocket money and round-trip travel expenses must be self-borne; those who are not interested in learning skills should not apply.
- (6) According to Article 3 of the Conscription Regulations for Naturalized Aliens & Returning Overseas Compatriot, men of military age who have original registered residence and have overseas compatriot identity will be subject to military conscription in accordance with the law when one year expires from the day after returning to the country.
- (7)People of the Mainland Area who reside outside the Mainland Area and subsequently change their status to that of a foreign national must, in accordance with Article 7 of the Enforcement Rules for the Act Governing Relations between Peoples of the Taiwan Area and the Mainland Area, meet the requirement of having the four-year period of overseas residency. (a period of four years calculated from the day following the date of arrival in the foreign country concerned, provided that during such four-year period, any single stay in the Mainland Area by such persons does not exceed 30 days. Where any single stay in the Mainland Area exceeds 30 days, the year during which such stay occurred shall not be included in the calculation of the four-year period). Additionally, they must provide documentation proving they have not registered a household or used a passport from Mainland China, in order to qualify for an Alien Resident Certificate (ARC) in Taiwan.
 - (8) Matters regarding visa conversion in Taiwan after completing the program:
- 1. Students must hold a valid Alien Resident Certificate, and obtain an official degree program admission notice from a domestic university and a certificate of registration completion during the period

of legal stay. Only then can they apply for visa conversion in Taiwan in the same way as The Overseas Youth Vocational Training School (non-degree program).

- 2. Relevant certificates must be submitted by students to apply for visa conversion:
- a. When a student applies for visa conversion, the student's program graduation certificate, academic transcript, and relevant documents required for applying for a residence visa for a formal degree program will be inspected.
- b. Proof of financial resources: Students in The Overseas Youth Vocational Training School (non-degree) do not need to produce proof of financial resources to convert into overseas compatriot students. If students in the training program want to apply for a conversion visa as overseas compatriot students after graduation, they must register through the OCAC with the Bureau of Consular Affairs of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Secretariat to facilitate the Ministry's control of the list.
- 3. During the validity period of the valid residence permit, students take their program graduation certificate to the NIA service station to apply for "extension of validity for 3 months"
