

OCAC 2027 Overseas Youth Vocational Training Program (OYVTP)

Admission Prospectus

I. Approved by: The OCAC in document Qiao Sheng Ju Zi No.: 1150501425 of June 26th, 2026.

II. Application eligibility

(1) Applicants must be ethnic compatriot students born overseas who have continuously resided abroad to date, or who have recently continuously resided overseas for at least six years and have obtained permanent or long-term residency documents in their place of residence, and whose status has been verified as accurate by an overseas recommending unit. The calculation of the most recent continuous six-year overseas residence period is based on the application deadline stated in this brochure, counting backward for six years.

Note 1: The six-year period is calculated backward from September 30, 2026 (i.e., from October 1, 2020 to September 30, 2026).

Note 2: “Overseas” refers to countries or regions other than China, Hong Kong, and Macau. “Continuous residence” means that the applicant has not stayed in Taiwan for more than 120 days in each calendar year (from January 1 to December 31). Therefore, continuous residence is determined by whether, within each of the above six years, the stay in Taiwan does not exceed 120 days per year. For years that are not complete calendar years within the calculation period, eligibility is determined based on whether the stay in Taiwan during that partial year does not exceed 120 days.

Note 3: Applicants meeting any of the following conditions shall not be regarded as having interrupted continuous overseas residence. Time spent in Taiwan under the following circumstances is not counted toward overseas residence, and the overseas continuous residence period must be recalculated accordingly. Applicants must submit supporting documents at the time of application for review:

- i. Studying in overseas youth technical training programs organized by the Overseas Community Affairs Council (OCAC), short-term non-degree programs, or technical training programs recognized by the central education authority.
- ii. Participating in activities organized or recognized by competent overseas affairs authorities, or enrolling in Mandarin language programs offered by government-approved overseas Mandarin education institutions, where the total duration is less than two years.
- iii. Exchange students, with a total exchange period of less than two years.
- iv. Approved internships in Taiwan by the central competent authority, with a total internship period of less than two years.
- V. Returning to Taiwan for military conscription and service.

- vi. Unable to return to the place of residence due to war, natural disasters, or large-scale epidemics.
- vii. Other reasons not attributable to the applicant, with supporting documentation proving inability to return to the place of residence.

Note 4: Permanent or long-term residency documents in the place of residence may be recognized through citizenship, permanent residency status, or endorsement of overseas compatriot status in the ROC (Taiwan) passport.

(2) Applicants must meet one of the following mandarin proficiency requirements:

- i. Achieve Level A1 or above in the Test of TOCFL (excluding the TOCFL Quick Screening Test).
- ii. Hold a graduation certificate from a Malaysian overseas compatriot school (Chinese primary school, independent high school, or national-type secondary school), or have at least two semesters of passing mandarin grades from the above-mentioned schools, in which case TOCFL results may be waived.

(3) Good moral character.

(4) Educational qualifications that meet the requirements of the applied program.

(5) Applicants who originally had household registration in Taiwan must not have a Republic of China (Taiwan) passport stamped with “Military service not yet fulfilled.”

III. Admission eligibility:

- (1) Overseas compatriot youth who have graduated from the second year of high school or above (i.e. have graduated from the second year of high school in an overseas compatriot school in the place of residence or are equivalent to the second year of high school in such a school, including those who have graduated from the fifth grade of a British system secondary school) and meet the qualifications of the Regulations Regarding Study and Counseling Assistance for Overseas Compatriot Students in Taiwan,.
- (2) Aged under 30 years old (born after July 1, 1996). Female applicants who have had children must submit relevant supporting documents. For each child, the applicant’s age may be extended by 2 years, but the maximum age shall not exceed 35 years.

Note 1: Academic credentials from foreign schools must first be verified by a ROC (Taiwan) overseas mission or by a recommending unit designated by the Overseas Community Affairs Council (OCAC). Academic credentials from Hong Kong or Macau must first be verified by an agency established or designated by the Executive Yuan in Hong Kong or Macau, or by an entrusted private organization. Academic credentials from Mainland China (including foreign schools established or with branches in Mainland China) must first be notarized by a notary office in Mainland China and then verified by an agency established or designated by the Executive Yuan or by an entrusted private organization. Academic credentials from Taiwanese schools overseas and Taiwanese business schools in Mainland China are considered equivalent to those of schools of the same level in Taiwan and therefore do not require notarization or verification.

Note 2: The school attended must be officially recognized by the competent education authority of the

local government.

IV. How to apply:

(1) Application time: from July 1, 2026 to September 30, 2026 (for applicants who apply by mail, the local postmark as proof).

(2) Application location:

Applicants must apply for recommendation through ROC (Taiwan) overseas missions or recommending units designated by the Overseas Community Affairs Council (OCAC).

(3) Submission of documents:

- i. Application Document Checklist for Students.
- ii. Application Form (2 copies). Each form must be attached with one recent 2-inch half-body, front-facing, hatless photo taken within the last 6 months. One copy shall be kept by the recommending unit for record
- iii. Affidavit.
- iv. Proof of Overseas Residence. Such as a copy of the applicant's local ID card, passport, or ROC (Taiwan) passport with overseas compatriot endorsement. All copies must be certified with the official seal of the recommending unit. The original documents must still be presented for verification upon arrival in Taiwan for enrollment. for applicants in Northern Thailand, an original household registration record or other documents proving Chinese/Taiwanese descent status must also be submitted, along with two photocopies; one copy will be retained by the recommending unit.
- v. Applicants holding Thai passports must provide proof of Thai citizenship when applying for a visa at the Taipei Representative Office in Thailand and when entering Taiwan at ports of entry.
- vi. Copies of graduation (or leaving) certificates and academic transcripts verified by ROC (Taiwan) overseas missions or certified by the recommending units. Foreign language documents must be translated into Mandarin.
- vii. Proof of Mandarin proficiency: as specified in Section 2 (b) of the admission guidelines.

V. Recruiting Schools and Programs:

All courses offered under the OYVTP are organized according to vocational categories to meet the practical needs of each respective industry. The curriculum places equal emphasis on both academic instruction and practical training. The program is implemented by schools selected by the Overseas Community Affairs Council (OCAC) that are well-equipped with complete and adequate facilities. For details of recruiting schools and programs, please refer to the attached list.

VI. Allocation, course start and admission regulations

- (1) Each course will be allocated in order according to the applications filled in by the qualified student. If the course applied for has not been offered, if there are still vacancies in a course that is offered, the course can be allocated in order according to other applications.
- (2) The training period for each course is from March 2027 to December 2027 (including the training period at school).
- (3) Check in for this course is from February 22 to February 26, 2027, and courses will officially start on March 2nd of the same year(The actual date is subject to the regulations of each school); students will cooperate with Taiwan's entry-related measures.
- (4) According to Article 5 of the Enforcement Rules for the Issuance of ROC Visas to Foreign-Passport Holders: "MOFA and overseas missions may request the applicant to undergo an interview or submit travel plans, proof of familial relations, results of health examinations, proof of criminal record, proof of financial status, proof of the purpose of visit, information regarding the applicant's contacts, relatives or guarantor in the ROC (Taiwan), and other documents as required for the review process." Admitted students holding foreign passports must apply for a visa to enter Taiwan in accordance with relevant regulations before they can study.
- (5) After a student arrives in Taiwan, if the documents submitted are found to be incompatible with the admission qualifications or the information filled in the application forms is false, admission eligibility may be cancelled, and he/she must immediately return to his/her place of residence at his/her own expense.
- (6) After arriving in Taiwan, students are required to undergo a health examination in accordance with regulations. If any student is found to be infected with a legally notifiable infectious disease or to have other health conditions, the school shall handle the matter in accordance with relevant laws and professional medical evaluations, and shall provide necessary counseling and reasonable accommodation measures.
- (7) During the training period, students should abide by school rules. If they violate the rules or fail to accept guidance, they will be punished or ordered to withdraw from training depending on the seriousness of the case, and they will immediately return to their place of residence at their own expense.
- (8) In order to facilitate the school's care and safety of the students in training, students in the program will all stay in the school dormitories.
- (9) If students fail to register for school or drop out for any reason after coming to Taiwan, he/she must immediately return to his/her place of residence and are not allowed to stay in Taiwan.
- (10) The training of agricultural, industrial, commercial and home economics professionals requires relatively high funding. Applicants must prepare their living expenses and various fees payable in Taiwan; the government will not provide any subsidies.
- (11) Those who have been admitted through allocation are not allowed to apply to transfer courses or schools midway.
- (12) OYVTP programs are non-degree training programs entrusted to universities and colleges for training. They do not provide formal student status. Those who have passed the training period and results meet the required standard will be issued a OYVTP graduation certificate in Mandarin

and English by the schools in accordance with regulations; those who have completed the required number of credits and passed the exam will be issued a credit certificate by each host school in accordance with the relevant provisions of the "Continuing Education Regulations for Universities"; those who have not completed the required number of credits will be issued a certificate of study..

- (13) Anyone who drops out or graduates from an OYVTP shall not apply to study in a vocational training program for 2 years.

VIII. Regulations relating to student application for entry into Taiwan, residence and household registration

- (1) For foreign passport holders, please present 1. Republic of China (Taiwan) visa application form (please go to the website of the Bureau of Consular Affairs of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, URL: <http://www.boca.gov.tw>, click on visa/fill in the application online form area/general visa application form, fill in each field in order, download, print and sign); 2. Passport (valid for more than 6 months); 3. two 2-inch color photos with white background taken within 6 months; 4. Notice of allocation; 5. Health examination certificate from the previous three months from a qualified overseas hospital approved by the Ministry of Health and Welfare (ask a local ROC overseas institution) (namely Health Certificate for Residence Application); please refer to the website of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention of the Ministry of Health and Welfare for details, URL: <http://www.cdc.gov.tw> Click on International Travel and Health/Foreigner Health Examination/Residence Health Examination); 6. Other relevant supporting documents required by our overseas institutions. Apply for a residence visa to come to Taiwan from our overseas institutions, and apply through the student online application system of the National Immigration Agency of the Ministry of the Interior (NIA) within 30 days from the day after entering the country. (<https://coa.immigration.gov.tw/coa-frontend/student/entry>) for an Alien Residence Certificate. If there is no foreign hospital recognized by the Ministry of Health and Welfare in the place where the overseas compatriot lives, contact an ROC overseas agency and follow the local visa procedures. When overseas students holding Thai passports apply for a visa at the ROC representative office in Thailand and enter Taiwan's airports or ports due to allocation, they must submit proof of Thai citizenship.
- (2) As a national without household registration in Taiwan, you should prepare at the place of residence
1. application form (submit 1 color photo with white background, in accordance with the national identity card specifications);
 2. proof of identity of the place of residence or place of residence;
 3. Taiwan passport or other documents that are sufficient to prove that you have Taiwan nationality;
 4. A national police record certificate from the applicant's place of residence or place lived (valid within 6 months from the date of issue; minors are exempt);
 5. Health examination certificate issued within the last 3 months by a qualified foreign hospital designated by the Centers for Disease Control of the Ministry of Health and Welfare or recognized by a Taiwan overseas institution in

the country of residence (inquire at overseas institution in place of residence. (Health Certificate for Residence Application) (please see the website of the Centers for Disease Control Ministry of Health and Welfare: <https://www.cdc.gov.tw> / Click "International Travel and Health"/Foreigner Health Management/Health Examination for Foreign Degree Students (including Mainland Students)/Residence Examination; 6. Admission notice and other relevant supporting documents. Apply to an overseas institution for transfer to the National Immigration Agency (NIA) for issue of a single-entry permit and a copy of the Taiwan Residence Certificate. Within 3 months from the day after entering Taiwan, go to the NIA with a copy of the residence certificate to replace the Taiwan Residence Certificate; those in Taiwan can prepare the above documents and entry permit, and apply for a Taiwan Residence Certificate through the NIA online student application system (<https://coa.immigration.gov.tw/coa-frontend/student/entry>).

- (3) Those who have original household registration in Taiwan should, within 30 days, go to the household registration office at the place of residence to register move-in (entry) submitting an ROC passport with entry stamp or copy of entry document.

IX. Related matters to note:

- (1) Applicants are requested to read this admission prospectus carefully before filling in various forms.
- (2) Overseas institutions and recommending units must confirm that the contents of each application form in Paragraph 3 of this prospectus related to application eligibility and Paragraph 4 related to application method are true before signing for recommendation.
- (3) After receiving the application form from each overseas institution, and after reviewing and approving the applicant to participate in the training, the OCAC will send the results of allocation to the relevant overseas institution to help the applicant to complete the formalities for travelling to Taiwan. You must arrive in Taiwan one week before the semester starts to check-in. If you exceed the deadline, you will not be allowed to apply to retain your admission qualifications.
- (4) Registered or unregistered admitted students may not apply to retain their admission eligibility for any reason.
- (5) Overseas institutions and recommending units are requested to inform applicants that all required expenses, daily pocket money and round-trip travel expenses must be self-borne; those who are not interested in learning skills should not apply.
- (6) Male applicants of military service age who are either Nationals with Household Registration (NWHRs) or Nationals Without Household Registration (NWOHRs) and possess Overseas Compatriot status shall be subject to conscription regulations in accordance with the Regulations Governing Military Service for Naturalized ROC Nationals and Returning Overseas Compatriots..
- (7) People of the Mainland Area who reside outside the Mainland Area and subsequently change their status to that of a foreign national must, in accordance with Article 7 of the Enforcement Rules for the Act Governing Relations between Peoples of the Taiwan Area and the Mainland Area, meet the requirement of having the four-year period of overseas residency. (a period of four years calculated from the day following the date of arrival in the foreign country concerned, provided that during such four-year period, any single stay in the Mainland Area by such persons does not exceed 30

days. Where any single stay in the Mainland Area exceeds 30 days, the year during which such stay occurred shall not be included in the calculation of the four-year period). Additionally, they must provide documentation proving they have not registered a household or used a passport from Mainland China, in order to qualify for an Alien Resident Certificate (ARC) in Taiwan.

(8) Matters regarding visa conversion in Taiwan after completing the program:

- i. Students must hold a valid Alien Resident Certificate, and obtain an official degree program admission notice from a domestic university and a certificate of registration completion during the period of legal stay. Only then can they apply for visa conversion in Taiwan in the same way as The OYVTP.
- ii. Relevant certificates must be submitted by students to apply for visa conversion:
 - a. When applying for a visa conversion, students shall be required by the relevant authorities to present their graduation certificate from the OYVTP, academic transcripts, and all residence visa-related documents required for admission to a formal degree program.
 - b. Students of the OYVTP are not required to submit proof of financial capability when converting their status to that of an overseas compatriot student. after graduation, students who wish to apply for a visa status conversion as overseas compatriot students may have their names included in a roster submitted by the OCAC to the Bureau of Consular Affairs, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, to facilitate the processing and verification of the relevant applications.
- iii. During the validity period of the valid residence permit, students take their program graduation certificate to the NIA service station to apply for "extension of validity for 3 months.
